

Why Bees Matter

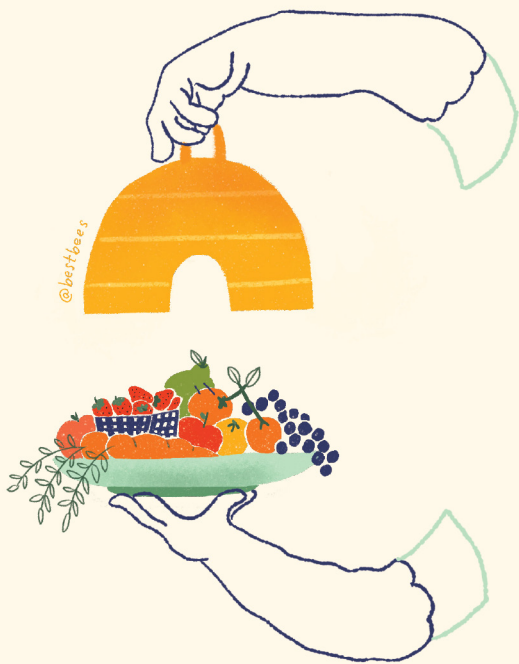

Bees = Food



Pollinators are responsible for one out of every three bites of food we eat. This includes over 70 crops of fruits and vegetables, as well as various nuts, herbs, spices, and even the plants that feed our cattle and livestock.



Economic Buzz

Pollinators as a whole contribute up to \$577 billion annually in global food production. Honeybees in the US alone contribute nearly \$20 billion.

Bloom & Blossom



Honeybees are essential pollinators, responsible for $\frac{1}{4}$ th of our planets flowering plant species. A single bee can visit up to 5,000 flowers per day and may cumulatively travel 500 miles during its lifetime.

The Sweet Spot

Whether you're mixing it in tea, treating for allergies, or soothing skin, honey is a celebrated byproduct of the honeybee. A single bee produces 1½ tsp of honey in its lifetime and 160 million pounds are produced in the US annually.



Save The Bees



Bees are still dying. On average, the U.S. lost 41% of managed beehives. Pesticides, diseases, and habitat loss are powerful contributors to the crisis.
